What you need to know about Anthem Student Advantage



Who is eligible?

All international students, scholars, visiting faculty or other persons with a current passport or non-immigrant F-1 or J-1 visa are eligible for and required to enroll in this coverage provided that:

- › They are temporarily located outside their home country or country of residence and have not been granted permanent residency status in the U.S., and
- › They are engaged in educational activities through the Policyholder.

Students engaged in Optional Practical Training (OPT) can also be covered under this policy, provided that:

- › The OPT program immediately follows a course of study,
- › The OPT program is no longer than 12 months in duration, and

- › Proof of OPT is provided (either copy of the second page of their I-20 which lists their OPT dates, their Employment Authorization Card, or an official letter from the school stating their OPT dates).



Coverage is available for dependents too

If you are covered by Anthem Student Advantage through University of California Los Angeles – Extension, you may enroll your lawful spouse, domestic partner or dependent children under the age of 26. Here is how it works:
